Please note: Horticultural portion of schedule has been changed to accommodate a new sequence of shows.

**Notice to Exhibitors:**

The CNE 2022 Flower and Vegetable Competitions, as well as Design classes are open to the general public and it is not necessary to be a member of any horticultural society or garden club. However, all exhibitors should carefully read the rules and regulations in the 2022 show schedule. It is also important when entering a class in any of the shows to strictly adhere to size and number that is being requested. Grooming is also very important, i.e. removing dead and damaged leaves and cleaning the pot, etc. In summary, always bring in the best entry possible, looking its “very best”. Be a part of the show and display your gardening skills.

1. Entry fee is \$1.00 per entry for classes in Sections 801 to 817. If paying by cheque: cheques can be made out to the “Canadian National Exhibition”.
2. The HST is **not** applicable because the entry fees are applied towards the prize money.
3. Entry forms must be received by the CNE by Friday, July 8, 2022 so that entry tags and Canadian National Exhibition grounds admission passes can be distributed to the exhibitors. (Entry forms received after this date will still be accepted, however, we cannot guarantee that passes and tags will be mailed out in time for the show being entered.) Additional entry tags are available at the Garden Show on actual day of all shows, prior to judging.
4.
  - A) All exhibitors must check in with the Show Chairman. This will commence at 6:45 a.m. and exhibitors must be checked in no later than 11:00 a.m.
  - B) All exhibits with correct entry tags must be in place no later than 11:30 a.m. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER 11:30 a.m.**
  - C) After 11:30 a.m. all work tables will be removed and floors cleaned by Horticulture Show Assistants.
  - D) From 11:30 a.m. to 12:15 p.m., the Show Convenor and Clerks will prepare staging of the Show.
  - E) Judging will commence promptly at 12:15 p.m.
5. **ALL EXHIBITORS MUST CHECK IN AND OUT WITH THE SHOW CHAIRMAN. FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN THE FORFEITURE OF ANY PRIZE MONEY EARNED FOR THAT SHOW. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST SETTLE ENTRY ACCOUNTING WITH THE SHOW CHAIRMAN BEFORE THE CHECK-IN DESK IS TAKEN DOWN.**

7. Approval for early removal of any entry, prior to the closing of the Heritage Court, at 10:00 p.m., on any day, must be given by the Horticulture Chairman. Failure to receive approval could result in forfeiting any prize money earned by that entry.
8. Exhibitors may make entries on day of show without having pre-registered.
9. Judging will be in accordance with Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards 2003 (OJES/2003) or with specialized societies to comply with their written rules.  
**PLEASE NOTE: EXHIBITORS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO REMAIN IN THE ACTUAL SHOW AREA AT JUDGING TIME. ONLY JUDGES, CLERKS AND SHOW COMMITTEE ARE ALLOWED. THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES WILL BE FINAL.**
10. Reasonable security will be supplied for the exhibitor's property, which must be claimed at the end of each show.
11. Each dollar in awards will have the value of one point. Cash awards will be mailed following the conclusion of the Canadian National Exhibition.
12. Any discrepancies in prize money paid out must be reported within thirty (30) days from date of cheque. No appeals will be considered after that date.
13. **Both top and bottom parts of entry cards must be filled in. The bottom part on winning entries is removed for the office records to send out prize money.**
14. When two or more exhibitors are jointly operating a garden they may not compete against each other except in Design and Potted Plants sections.

#### **HORTICULTURAL SECTION:**

15. All specimen class entries must be grown by the exhibitor that is named on the entry tag for at least **three months** prior to the show. Specimens named, if possible.
16. Exhibitors are allowed more than one entry per class provided they are of different cultivars. If the exhibitor enters more than one entry of the same cultivar in any one class, all their entries in the class will be disqualified and any awards given will be null and void.
17. Containers will be supplied for cut specimens UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED IN THE SCHEDULE. Entries are not transferable to another section, as all entries will be displayed for the duration of that show.
18. A single specimen within any form of collection or basket is not eligible to receive an award on its own merit. The collection or basket must be judged as a whole entry.

19. The exhibitor must have grown houseplants, planters and terrariums for at least **three months** prior to exhibiting. **This rule will be strictly enforced. Any exhibitor found to be in contravention of this rule will forfeit any prize monies for the current year. In addition the exhibitor will be banned from participating in future years.** If the show committee suspects an entry is a recently potted up exhibit and not an established planting called for in the rules, then the show committee does have the right to check. Any exhibit that has insects or is diseased will be removed by the show committee and will not receive any awards.
20. In all potted plant classes, measurements given in show schedule are the container's inside diameter dimensions. Exhibitors must conform to these measurements.
21. Vegetable Section 812, since flavour, interior flesh colour and quality often account for point values, many specimens may need to be cut, and/or tasted, if point values of entries are otherwise close.
22. In any class the judge may award an honourable mention, when merited, with a minimum prize value of \$3.00. Maximum of two honourable mentions in any class.
23. A Championship Rosette with a cash award of \$10.00 will be given for the Best in Show in each section. A Judge's Choice with a cash award of \$5.00 may be awarded at the discretion of the horticultural judge.
24. **The Dave Money Award**  
**For each Horticulture Show, The Dave Money Award for one outstanding Exhibit will be awarded by the Judges. The prize money for this award will be \$50.00.**
25. **All exhibitors must be in place and making their entries in the show by 11:00 a.m. No new exhibitors will be allowed to enter or exhibit entries from 11:00-11:30 a.m. Final entries are to be made during this time period. At 11:30 a.m. the Horticulture Show Assistants will come over to clear away the work tables and sweep the floor in readiness for judging to commence at 12:15 p.m.**

#### **DESIGN SECTION:**

26. **All Design entries must be the entire work of the exhibitor named on the flower show entry tag. No other manual assistance is permitted.**
27. All fresh designs must be constructed by the exhibitor at the Canadian National Exhibition on the day of the show. The only designs which can be prearranged are the dried miniatures, and dried small. All designs must be the exhibitors own work.
28. **Fresh plant material must be included in every class unless otherwise stated.** Accessories permitted. Designs viewed from front unless otherwise stated. Fresh plant material must be in water or water retaining material and kept in show condition. Containers are not supplied.
29. Background colour of drapes will be a light gray.
30. Unless otherwise stated, designs will be placed on sono tubes with a disk having a diameter of 16 inches (40.6 cm). The height of the tubes are 30 inches (76.2 cm), 33 inches (83.3 cm) and 39 inches (99 cm), or on black open ended cubes 20" W x 20" D x 19" H (50.8 x 50.8 x 48.3 cm). Allotted width 32" (81 cm).
31. Miniature designs will be placed in niches 5" W x 3" D x 5½" H (13 x 7.5 x 14 cm) with a white background. For miniature designs see OJES/2003, page 86. Fresh plant

material must be in water.

32. A small design from 5 ½" – 10" (14 cm – 25.4 cm) which must not exceed 10" (25.4 cm) in width, 10" (25.4 cm) in depth or 10" (25.4 cm) in height. Hanging small design is to be equipped to hang from a horizontal wire which is attached to a standing metal frame.
33. Exhibition Table Type II (ref: OJES/2003, pg. 87) to be staged on top of one 20" x19" (50.8 cm x 48.3 cm) black open ended cube which can be covered, if the designer wishes to. Two black frames will be provided to sit on top of the cube, to be used only if you wish to incorporate either one or both frames into your design. One frame will be 14" W x 3 ⅝" D x 14" H (35.6 x 9.2 x 35.6 cm). Second frame will be approx. 24" W x 3 ⅝" D x 36"H (61 x 9.2 x 91.4 cm). Plant material must be included. Dining components should dominate over accessories. Allotted space 40" W x 22" D x 76" H (101.6 x 55.9 x 193 cm) [56" (142.2 cm) high from black cube top].
34. Large Design classes to be staged on a black open ended cube 20" x 20" x 19" (50.8 x 50.8 x 48.3 cm) open on two sides. The allotted space is 40" W x 30" D x 86" H from ground (101.6 x 76.2 x 218.4 cm) [66" (167.6 cm) high from cube top].
35. All design classes will be judged. Design classes may not be subdivided.
36. JUDGE MAY AWARD AN HONOURABLE MENTION WHEN MERITED. MAXIMUM OF TWO HONOURABLE MENTIONS IN ANY CLASS.
37. Prize money for Exhibition Tables, Type II: 1<sup>st</sup> - \$40.00, 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$30.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$20.00, H.M. - \$10.00
38. Prize money for Large Designs: 1<sup>st</sup> - \$40.00, 2<sup>nd</sup> - \$30.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$20.00, H.M. - \$10.00
39. Rosettes Awarded as Follows:
  - One – Best in Show - \$15.00
  - One – Runner Up to Best in Show - \$10.00
  - One – The Most Creative Design - \$10.00
  - One – Judge's Choice - \$10.00
40. **All exhibitors must be in place and making their entries in the show by 11:00 a.m. No new exhibitors will be allowed to enter or exhibit entries from 11:00-11:30 a.m. Final entries are to be made during this time period. At 11:30 a.m. the Horticulture Show Assistants will come over to clear away the work tables and sweep the floor in readiness for judging to commence at 12:15 p.m.**
41. Exhibition eligibility for Novice categories pertains to persons who have not previously won three 1<sup>st</sup> place prize ribbons in CNE Design Competitions.
42. New designs for 2022
  - A. Floral Design – Term used to describe a combination of fresh and/or dried plant materials and/or inorganic objects arranged to produce an artistic unit.
  - B. Modern Mass Design – A design of multiple groups (usually 3-5) of plant materials (each group composed of one variety of plant material) juxtaposed to give sculptural effect. It may be a solid mass or a mass with space emphasizing strong colours, textures, and forms.
  - C. Parallel Design – A design in which three or more groupings are placed in a parallel manner with open spaces between the groupings. The parallel

direction may be vertical, horizontal, or diagonal. The design is in one container or in containers combined so as to appear as one unit. There are two types of Parallel Design:

- Vegetative Parallel – A design of plant material as it grows in nature. Taller growing flowers are placed higher in the design and shorter growing flowers are placed lower. There is no mixing of seasons. Plant material is not abstracted or manipulated. Any accessories used must be objects naturally found in an area where the plant material would grow, e.g. pebbles, sand, etc.
  - Decorative Parallel – A design in which plant materials can be used in less naturalistic ways. This type has a more contemporary feel, with fewer components and bolder forms. Non-plant material can be used, e.g. copper pipe, plastic grid, etc.
- D. Still Life – A design in which plant material and inanimate objects are grouped to tell a story or interpret a theme. Objects used must be true to function and realistic in size, form, and colour. Some plant material must be included, but is subordinate to the objects.
- E. Synergistic – A design in which at least three containers or units are used in a composition. At least three of the units must contain plant material. Each unit may be a complete or partial design and the combined units create a unified whole. The design may be further unified through the use of connectives.
- F. Water Viewing – A traditional line design, adapted in Canada in the 1960's, with a dominant line of plant material and great use of space, in a shallow container with 1/2 – 2/3 of the container space showing water. Modern line design does not fit this definition but could be used in a design calling for Visible Use of Water.
- G. Oriental Manner – An arrangement that is asymmetrical with empty space between the design details and that the creative materials are in harmony. It expresses a movement usually restrained to the use of minimal plant materials based on the principle of line, form, and meaning to express the beauty and harmony of the natural world.

### **FROM THE NORTH:**

*Approach Toronto on Highway 400. Take highway 401 west to highway 427 which you take south. Exit at the Queen Elizabeth Way (QEW) which you take east. Exit onto Lakeshore Boulevard. Make a left-hand turn onto Strachan Avenue. Enter the CNE at Fleet Street.*

### **FROM THE EAST:**

*Approach Toronto on the 401 highway. Exit south onto the Don Valley Parkway. Continue until it turns into the Gardiner Expressway. Exit at Spadina/Lakeshore Boulevard exit. Take the Lakeshore Boulevard west to Strachan Avenue. Turn right and then left at Fleet Street to enter the CNE.*
